155 still missing

Raj Kumar Parajuli Sindhupalchowk, August 3

At least 155 people are missing after a landslide struck. Sindhupalchowk yesterday and rescuers have lost any hope of finding them alive though rescue operations continued today as well in Sindhupalchowk.

Sindhupalchowk CDO Gopal Prasad Parajuli said 155 missing people have been identified and the number of the missing could go up as the district administration was collecting data on loss and damage to life and property. He ruled out the possibility of finding any missing person alive.

The landslide that blocked the Sunkoshi River had buried more than 20 houses in Jure bazaar and 50 in Mankha VDC. More than 5,000 residents from over a dozen VDCs have been displaced.

Police said one more unidentified body was recovered from the incident site today, raising the death toll to 10. Local administration reported that 27 people stuck under the debris were rescued today.

The landslide swept away five more houses this morning. It has also damaged two iron gates of Lamosanghu-Sunkoshi hydro electricity



SINDHUPALCHOWK: Tek Bahadur Timilsina, 63, of Jure has been searching for his 30-year-old daughter-in-law Mithu, who ran a grocery store in Jure Bazaar, and his two grandsons Rajiv and Ramit, aged 10 and 8, respectively, after they went missing in the landslide on Sunday morning. "Thave been looking for them since morning and I'm losing hope to find them alive," said Tek Bahadur, whose son has gone to UN peace mission.

Another local, Ram Bahadur Lama, said five members each from his and his brother's family had gone missing. "Where shall I search for them? I don't hope to even find their bodies," said Lama. He said he and his son were the only ones from his family to have survived the tragedy.

Ganesh Kumari Paudel, a peon at local Bansanghu Secondary School, can't find her daughter-in-law and grandchildren after the landslide struck.—HNS

Landslide hits five hydropower projects

Creates a shortfall of 66.5MW electricity in national grid

landslide massive Sindhupalchowk district Saturday that caused an abrupt interruption in the flow of the Sunkoshi River has hit five hydropower projects downstream.

According to Nepal Electricity Authority (NEA), there will be shortfall of 66.5MW electricity in the national grid due to the landslide.

Power transmission from five hydropower projects Bhotekoshi (45MW), Sunkoshi (10MW), Sanima Sunkoshi (2.5MW), Chaku (6MW) and Bhairabkunda (3MW) has been halted temporarily. In the current situation, the shortfall of 66.5MW electricity means an increment in load-shedding by one and half hours a day.

NEA said the landslide at Jure has swept away two gates of the Sunkoshi Power House headworks. according to NEA.

While the power house of Bhote Koshi is safe, electricity supply has been interrupted due to the damage caused in three of its transmission line towers. One of the towers was completely swept away in the landslide, while the remaining two have been partially damaged.

The power house of Sanima Sunkoshi Project has been submerged. "The power house and all equipment are under the water. said Tuk Prasad Paudel, director of Sanima Hydropower Company.

Two other projects—Chaku and Bhairabkunda too are out of

order following problems in trans mission line towers.

The situation might turn worse if the river blocked by the landslide debris starts flowing with force. A possible flood might sweep away headworks of other power houses causing more losses," said NEA officiating Managing Director Ram Chandra Pandey

NEA is considering increasing electricity imports from India to neutralise the loss. "We are trying to increase imports from places like Raxaul and Kataiya of India to meet the demand," said Pandey, adding how much energy will be imported from India will be finalised on Sunday.

Since the country has only one storage-type project, NEA has no other option, but to increase power imports.

13 KILLED, OVER 200 MISSING IN MUDSLIDE

Blocked Sunkoshi River begins to flow smooth

The water clogged by a nassive landslide at Jure of Ramche VDC early Saturday norning up the Sunkoshi River began to flow after the Nepal Army personnel caused two plasts at the debris.

"The blocked water drained out from the northern side of the River," said Kamal Dwibedi, 1 member of the NA rescue

He said that further dangers

of flash floods had receded. The debris created a four kilometer long lake with 40-metre high dams, almost the size of Fewa

In order to minimize the impending dangers, the two helicopters and a group of 40 security personnel are on a standby near the disaster-hit

Following the blasts at 2:20 pm and 2:50 pm today, the water level went down by two metres. The debris filled up the river at Jure, sending the water level 130 metres above the river bed.

At least nine people were killed and about 200 others went missing in the landslip.


Around 40 people are wounded and 80 houses were swept away. Thousands of people have been displaced and they are likely to be stranded on the hills of Sindhuplachok and Sindhuli at night as their rehabilitation task became difficult with the falling of

The people from Lamosanghu to Khurkot had fied toward safer places after the creation of the big lake by the landslide debris. The frightened locals were seen running helter-skelter with their kids on the back.

The death toll is likely to rise as the landslip buried several settlements of four VDCs -Dhuskun, Makha, Tekanpur and Ramche.

Landslide blocks river, kills 8

• Scores missing in Sindhupalchowk • 70 houses buried

Sindhupalchowk, August 2

A massive landslide in Sindhupalchowk's Ramche VDC swept away the entire Jure bazaar this morning, leaving at least eight persons dead and more than 40 injured. Many persons are said to have gone missing. The landslide that occurred

The landslide that occurred around 2:00am buried over 70 houses of Jure, leaving scores of people missing while the huge debris of the landslip has blocked the Sunkoshi River, turning the river upstream into a lake.

The swollen river poses a threat to villages downstream in case the accumulated water bursts through the blockade. The almost four-km long swollen river stretch from the blocked site has submerged as many as 150 houses and the power house of Sanima hydropower project on the river front.

The deceased include a child, three women and four men. According to Inspector Jeyashwor Rimal of the Barhabise Police Post, 40 persons, including a Belgian national, have been rescued, while a severed

human arm was found from the landslide debris. "Though 18 persons are said to be missing, the number is yet to be confirmed as a number of houses were swept away in the disaster." said Rimal.

Of the injured, 13 have been airlifted to the Capital while the rest are undergoing treatment in Sindhupalchowk. "I was asleep when the shaking of the ground woke me up. When I learnt about the blocked river I fled to a higher place with my family," recounted Rajendra Timalsina of Iholunge, Lamosanghu, adding, "We came to our houses at the break of

dawn only to return with our belongings." Security personnel have shifted people living near the swollen part of the river to safer places. "Death roll will be known only after studying the VDC data," said CA member from Sindhupalchowk Mohan Bahadur Basnet.

Meanwhile, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi today expressed concern about the blockage on the Sunkoshi River in Nepal. According to India. Press Information Bureau, he has directed that all possible help should be provided to Nepal and the Bihar government.

More villages under threat

SINDHUPALCHOWK: Keeping in view the threat from the blocked water, teams of local administration, Nepali Army and road division reached the site to discuss ways to open the blocked river. Nepali Army got triggered explosives on the heap of the landslip debris at 10:00 am and later at 2:00pm. The government has urged the Indian government to open all the sluice gates of the Koshi Barrage. The government has declared the area within 200 metres on the riverfront from Jure to Koshi Barrage crisis-prone zone. In Sindhupalchowk itself, villages near the river like Lamosanghu, Barhabise, Khadichaur, Balefi and Sukute bazaar face high risk of flooding.—HAES
